

## RECYCLING SAVES!!!!

Recycling one ton of newspaper saves 17 trees. If each KY household recycled one average Sunday newspaper, that would save over 16,000 trees in a single day.

Recycling one pound of glass saves enough energy to light a 100 watt bulb for four hours.

Kentuckians use 37,000 beverage bottles each hour. If each KY household recycled just one plastic bottle each week, in one year that would represent \$303,298.00 in Recycled material and a landfill Tipping fee savings of \$84,924.00 for a total value of \$388,220.00 a year.

# Materials for Recycling

## PAPER

Newspaper, Books,  
Telephone books and Magazines.

## GLASS

Clear glass bottles & jars only. In the near future colored glass & jars will be accepted. (Watch for details)

### DO NOT INCLUDE:

Plate glass, Pyrex, Ceramics, light bulbs or mirrors

## PLASTIC

Any plastic beverage & milk containers with #1 & #2 on the bottom of the container.

## CANS

Aluminum & Steel including pet food cans & cans with white lining.

### DO NOT INCLUDE:

Aluminum scraps such as foil or siding.

**ABSOLUTELY NO FOOD WASTE**

## Recycling Containers

## PREPARATION FOR RECYCLING

### NEWSPAPERS MUST BE DRY

Secure newspaper with string or place in brown paper bag. Cardboard must be dry, breakdown boxes.

### Glass

Clear glass bottles & jars. Rinse containers, remove lids and caps. Labels do not need to be removed.

### PLASTIC

Rinse containers, remove lids and caps. Labels do not need to be removed.

### CANS

Aluminum & Steel. Empty cans, rinse & remove food waste or refuse.
